I. Introduction

* Paul was the apostle of faith; John was the apostle of love; and Peter was the apostle of hope! (v. 1)

- A. Peter was the writer of this general epistle.
 - 1. Peter (v. 1)
 - 2. His name
 - 3. His call
 - 4. His fall
 - 5. His commission
 - a) "an apostle" (v. 1)
 - b) All believers are called to represent Christ's interests here on earth. We are all supposed to be missionaries, whether at home or abroad.
- B. The recipients of the letter (v.1)
 - 1. "strangers"
 - 2. "resident aliens"
 - 3. "scattered"
 - a) "diaspora" or "seed"
- C. Peter's purpose for this letter?
 - 1. Because these Christians were "strangers who were scattered."
 - a) They were suffering persecution (1 Peter 1:6; 1 Peter 4:12)
 - b) It has been normal for Christians to suffer persecution. However, we Christians living in the Western world have not until recently.
 - 2. Peter was writing to help these suffering believers "stand" in the face of opposition.
 - a) Stand in three areas:
 - 1) Your salvation (1 Peter 1:1-2:10)
 - 2) Your submission (1 Peter 2:11 3:12)
 - 3) Your suffering (1 Peter 3:12 5:11)
- D. Peter starts with "salvation." Why? It's doctrine!
 - 1. Peter wants us to "stand" in two aspects of our salvation.
 - a) Its election
 - b) Its hope

II. Stand in Salvation's Election (1 Peter 1:2)

- * Peter gives us three reasons to celebrate:
 - A. God the Father chose you (v. 2)
 - 1. "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father" (v. 2)
 - B. God the Spirit set you apart (v. 2)
 - 1. "Sanctification of the Spirit"
 - C. God the Son died for me (v. 2)
 - 1. "...unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ" (v. 2)
 - 2. "for obedience to Jesus Christ" (v. 2)
 - 3. We must believe or trust in Jesus Christ
 - a) It's faith in Christ
 - 4. "God hath from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth" (2 Thessalonians 2:13)
 - 5. Jesus is the object of our faith
 - 6. "..and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ" (v. 2)
 - a) The blood of His cross
 - b) We are forgiven by grace and have peace
 - c) Stand in your salvation

III. Stand in Salvation's Hope (1 Peter 1:3-5)

- * Our salvation brings us:
 - A. A living hope (v. 3)
 - 1. The resurrection of Jesus Christ, our living hope
 - a) His pardon
 - b) His presence
 - c) His power
 - d) His pattern
 - B. A heavenly hope (v. 4)
 - 1. Our salvation guarantees heaven
 - 2. (v.4) "reserved" or "garrison"
 - 3. Jesus promised (John 14)
 - 4. Jesus prayed (John 17)
 - a) Heaven is our inheritance (v. 4)
 - b) It's incorruptible; it won't decay
 - c) It's undefiled or won't tarnish
 - d) It will not fade away (v. 4)

- C. A secure hope (v. 5)
 - 1. God's keeping power (v. 5)
 - 2. God's keeping purpose (Romans 8:1)
 - a) "Moreover, whom He did predestinate, them He also called, them He also justified; and whom He justified, them he also glorified." (Romans 8:30)
