"Submission in Marriage for Husbands" 1 Peter 3:7

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I. Introduction

- * Peter Marshall- "Marriage is not a federation of two sovereign states. It's a union of domestic, social, spiritual and physical. It is a fusion of two lives, the coming together of two tributaries, which after being joined in marriage, will flow in the same direction, carrying the same burdens of responsibility and obligation."
 - A. Marriage is God's idea.
 - 1. "Therefore shall a man leave...and they shall become one flesh" (Genesis 2:24).
 - 2. "So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate" (Matthew 19:6).
 - B. The two (man and wife) are male and female.
 - 1. (Matthew 19:4)
 - 2. Each has a duty, function, or role.
 - C. The wife's duty (1 Peter 3:1-6)
 - 1. Her behavior (submission) (vv. 1-2)
 - 2. Her beauty (spiritual) (vv. 3-4)
 - 3. Her belief (trust in God) (vv. 5-6)
 - D. Now, Peter gives instructions to the husbands (v. 7)
 - 1. Three responsibilities of the husband

II. Love Your Wife Sincerely

- * "Husbands love your wives" (Ephesians 5:25). It's agape love. It means that you love her:
 - A. Unconditionally
 - 1. "As Christ also loved the church"
 - B. Sacrificially
 - 1. "and gave Himself for her"
 - C. Sanctifying
 - 1. (Ephesians 5:26)
 - D. Affectionately
 - 1. (v.29) "nourish and cherish"
 - E. Exclusively
 - 1. (v.31) "for this cause shall a man leave"

III. Dwell with Your Wife Understandingly

- A. "Likewise you husbands dwell with them according to the knowledge..." (v. 7)
 - 1. "Likewise" or "in the same way"
 - a) "Submitting yourselves to one another in the fear of God" (Ephesians 5:21)
 - b) The same Holy Spirit that makes a wife "meek and quiet" (v. 4) would make the husband "kind and considerate" (v. 7)
 - c) The key is to be filled with the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:18)
- B. "Dwell with them" (v. 7)
 - 1. It's a good idea for married couples to live together.
 - 2. It is much more than simply sharing the same address. The compound verb "dwell with" occurs only here in the New Testament. It has a general and specific meaning.
 - a) The general meaning
 - 1) It's to "live with" or "be at home with."
 - 2) The idea is to make a life together.
 - 3) The husband is to be the head of the family and to love and lead. He should be a provider and a protector.
 - 4) Too many husbands are not home enough to love and lead their families.
 - 5) Some are home, but they are not really home. Their focus is on their work or other things. Their marriage and family are not a priority.
 - b) The specific meaning
 - 1) Some New Testament scholars see the phrase "dwell with" as a euphemism for sexual relations.
 - 2) It's the "one flesh"
 - a. (1 Corinthians 7:1-6)
 - b. (1 Timothy 3:2)
 - 3. How are husbands to swell with their wives?
 - a) "according to knowledge" (v. 7)
 - 1) In an understanding way
 - 2) It's physical
 - 3) It is also intellectual (understand them)
 - a. Charles Swindoll- "The success of your dwelling with your wife is in direct proportion to your knowledge of her."
 - b. It carries the idea of "to be considerate."
 - c. Husbands often don't realize before it's too late that they are not being considerate of their wives.

- i. Her likes and dislikes
- ii. Her feelings
- iii. Her fears
- iv. Her cares
- v. Her expectations

IV. Honor Your Wife Highly

- A. "Giving honor unto the wife" (v. 7b)
 - 1. It's to "assign a great price."
 - 2. Same as (v. 4) "great price"
 - a) Husbands, do you assign great value to your wife?
 - b) If so, tell her and treat her like she is valuable (it's emotional)
 - 3. Allistair Begg- "There is no more precious gift entrusted to a man than the treasure of his wife. She is to be admired and prized above all others. She is to have first place in his heart, mind and affections."
 - 4. Don't take your wife for granted.
 - a) How? By words and actions
 - i. Tell her
 - ii. Show her
 - 5. Husbands, do you
 - a) Love your wife sincerely?
 - b) Dwell with your wife understandingly?
 - c) Honor your wife highly?

V. Three Reasons to Love, Dwell, and Honor Your Wife

- A. Your wife is the weaker vessel (v. 7)
 - 1. It's comparative (weaker)
 - 2. In what way is she weaker?
 - a) Physically
 - b) Positionally

- 1) Her submission
- 2) Don't take advantage of her position in submission
- 3) The marriage duties are reciprocal
- B. "You are heirs together of the grace of life" (v. 7)
 - 1. Same Savior and Lord
 - 2. Same grace
 - 3. The same life of God
 - a) It's the spiritual dimension
 - b) She's your sister in Christ
 - c) She's a child of God
- C. "That your prayers be not hindered" (v. 7)
 - 1. Peter assumes that husbands and wives would pray together
 - a) Satan wants to keep you from prayer
 - 2. A reason God won't answer prayer
 - 3. You can't be right with God if you are wrong with your wife
 - a) Jesus said, "Leave your gift at the altar."
