"Living in the Last Days" 1 Peter 4:7-11

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I. Introduction

- A. Peter was writing to Christians who were facing a "fiery trial" (v. 12).
 - 1. Illustration- The fires in California. Urgency and priority
 - 2. "The end of all things was at hand" (v. 7).
 - 3. They needed to have a sense of urgency and priority
 - 4. Today, we are also facing "fiery trials" and "the end of things is at hand."
- B. What does Peter mean by the statement "the end of things is at hand?"
 - 1. The consummation
 - 2. God stated that He will end it
 - 3. For the church, Christ's coming is imminent
 - 4. How, then, should we spend our time?
 - a) With a sense of urgency and priority
 - b) 1 Peter is not only doctrinal, but it is very practical
 - c) "Be ye therefore" (v. 7)
- C. Peter gives us five commands on how to live in a hostile world

II. Be Sober (1 Peter 4:7)

- A. "Be ye sober" (v. 7)
 - 1. It's an aorist imperative. An urgent and decisive action
 - 2. It was used for a person who was of sound mind. It means to be self-controlled and balanced in your reactions
 - a) Keep your mind steady and clear
 - b) William Barclay- "Preserve your sanity"
 - c) It's the opposite of "mania" or "maniac"
 - d) In context- "The End of Time"
 - e) Don't get imbalanced or freak out
 - f) Keep your cool
 - g) How? By prayer

III. Watch and Pray (1 Peter 4:7)

- A. "Watch and pray" (v. 7)
 - 1. "Be alert"

- a) It's the opposite of being "drunk" or "asleep."
- 2. Don't be intoxicated by the world's ideas or values
 - a) Be alert. Watch and pray
 - b) Illustration- Peter in the garden
- 3. Peter learned his lesson on how to pray
 - a) Illustration- (Acts 4)
 - 1) "Lord, you are God" (God's person)
 - 2) "Who by the mouth of thy servant David said" (God's promises)
 - 3) "Give us boldness to speak your Word" (God's power)
- 4. Jesus is coming. Don't fall asleep. Be alert and prayerful. Be clear-minded.

IV. Have Fervent Love (1 Peter 4:8)

- A. "Above all, keep fervent in your love (agape) for one another because love covers a multitude of sins." (Proverbs 10:12)
 - 1. As the world gets more hostile towards Christians, we need the love and fellowship of other believers
- B. Peter moves to relationships in the church community
 - 1. If there is one thing that should mark a Christian community, it is love
 - a) "Above all" (v. 8) or "all things"
 - b) Love is to have first place
 - 2. Love is to be "fervent" or "stretched out"
 - a) It pictures an athlete straining to reach the goal
 - b) We are to work hard at love
 - c) Give it all you've got. It's not easy
 - 3. Why should we have fervent love for one another?
 - a) "Because" or "for love covers a multitude of sins" (v. 8)
 - i. "Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all sins" (Proverbs 10:12).
 - b) What does it mean that "love covers all sins?"
 - i. It doesn't mean love condones sin
 - ii. It means in love, we forgive and forget the sins people commit against us
 - iii. It is treating others the way God treats us
 - a. A cool head (v. 7)

- b. A prayerful heart (v. 7)
- c. A fervent love (v. 8)

V. Use Hospitality (1 Peter 4:9)

- A. Love opens its heart and its home
 - 1. Note its importance in Peter's day
 - 2. Also, for us today (spiritual leaders)
 - 3. Hospitality is literally "loving strangers."
 - 4. "Be not forgetful to entertain stranger for some..." (Hebrews 13:2)
 - a) Illustration- Abraham's tent
 - b) "without grudging" (v. 9)

VI. Use Your Gifts (1 Peter 4:10-11)

- A. Facts about Spiritual Gifts
 - 1. Every Christian has received at least one gift.
 - a) "Each one has received a gift" (v. 10).
 - b) It comes from the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:7)
 - 2. It's to be used to minister to others.
 - a) "Minister it to one another" (v. 10).
 - 3. We are to be good stewards (v. 10)
 - 4. They are grace gifts (v. 10)
 - 5. There are many different kinds of gifts.
 - a) (Romans 12)
 - b) (1 Corinthians 12)
 - c) (Ephesians 4)
 - d) (1 Peter 4)
 - e) Peter mentions two kinds of gifts.
 - 1) Speaking
 - a. "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God" (v.
 - 11).

- 2) Serving
 - a. "If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies" (v. 11).
- 6. The gifts are to be used to bless others and glorify God.
 - a) "That in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom being the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" (v. 11).
 - b) One day, we will hear, "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:21).
